 For and in consideration of the sum of three thousand
 Dollars to him in hand paid the receipt whereof he
 both Hereby acknowledge Hath and by these presents
 both Give Grant Bargain Sell alien Infeoff convey
 and confirm unto the sd John Sever and his heirs &
 assigns forever Nine Tracts or parcels of Land again-
 ing each other and containing by Estimation three
 thousand one hundred acres situate lying and being
 in the County of Washington and State of Tennessee
on the south side of Nolichucky River and including a
 small Island in the sd River. Bounded as follows (to wit)

and the sd John Bowmans line beginning at a

corner then with his line south 82 Deg East 22 poles
