Dear Mr. Young:

Thank you for your request regarding James Curtis (1746-1818).

Three women have joined the DAR as descendants of Curtis, each through a different child of James and Jemima (nee Alger) Curtis: Cornelius, Lovisa and Sally.

The basic material in support of lineage has been the record of a Curtis family Bible and of a cemetery site. Enclosed from New York Genealogical Records Committee (GRC) volumes B-33 and V-72 are copies of these records. The paper through Lovisa, who married Benjamin Randall, also provided transcriptions of newspaper items. The most recent paper, of 1978 through Sally, cited the enclosed pages from *The New England Historical and Genealogical Register*, volume 87. Enc. #1

Based on these applications and material, the DAR had listed the birth date and place of James Curtis as 10 February 1746, Goshen, New York. However, a review of the very first application and specifically one poorly cited reference suggests that he was born 1743 in Connecticut. Enc. #2

That first paper has a reference to "Thomas Wetherfield, CT." Enclosed are pages from *Thomas Curtis of Wethersfield, Connecticut* regarding a Joseph Curtis family that moved from Wethersfield to Goshen CT and then to Dutchess County NY. *Thomas Curtis* refers to 1) Hinman – see *Early Puritan Settlers of the Colony of Connecticut* and to 2) Stiles II – see *The History of Ancient Wethersfield*, Volume II. Enc. #3

Finally, a Goshen CT birth record lists James Curtis, son of Joseph, born Feb. 10, 1743. (A brother Joseph was born January 1747.) See *The Barbour Collection of CT Town Vital Records*, Volume 14. Enc. #4

Dutchess County NY Tax Lists 1718-1787 shows a Joseph Curtis in the Nine Partners/Crum Elbow precinct area as early as 1753. James Curtis is also listed there from 1772-1779. Enc. #5 The DAR credits James Curtis with service in the Dutchess County Militia 6th Regt. as listed on page 248 of Roberts' New York in the Revolution. Enc. #6

"Orlando Randall who died at his home in Moss Point, Miss., on Thursday last, was born in McDonough, March 9, 1831. His parents were Benjamin and Lovisa Randall, pioneer settlors in that section, having migrated from Connecticut.

Deceased was twice married. His first wife whose maiden name was Sally Martin, died while he resided in Norwich, and in 1868 he married Mrs. Caroline (Miner) Newton of Guilford, who survives him. He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Hubert L. Brown of Horvich and a gr. daughter, Mrs. Albert Mercer, of Pasadena, Cal.

Buried in Mt. Hope cenetery, Norvich."

Daniel⁴ Curtis was probably the Daniel who was licensed by the " County Court, April 1735, "to prosecute the art and mystery of tanning leather." He resided in Torrington and had 2 children. (Stiles II, 264)

22. ZACHARIAH⁴ CURTIS (Joseph³, Joseph², Thomas¹), son of Joseph and Dorothy (Edwards) Curtis, was born 13 Sep 1719 in Wethersfield, Conn. He died 14 Hay 1805.

He married first Hary Ann

He married second Lena Wheeler.

He bought land in Goshen, Conn., in 1749, and moved to Redhook-onthe-Hudson in Dutchess Co., N.Y. in 1750. From there he moved to Dorset, Vt. Several of his sons served in the Continental Army. (Cutter, <u>Hestern</u> History of New York, II, 984; Stiles II, 265-266; Hinman, 780-781, 784)

He had thirteen children by his first wife and twelve by his second wife. However, between Stiles and Cutter I could find only fifteen.



The South line of the Middle Ward runs east from mouth of the Wappingers Creek, so that people in the Nine Partners Precinct may be in either Ward.



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


