Dear Mr. Young:

Thank you for your request regarding James Curtis (1746-1818).

Three women have joined the DAR as descendants of Curtis, each through a different child of James and Jemima (nee Alger) Curtis: Cornelius, Lovisa and Sally.

The basic material in support of lineage has been the record of a Curtis family Bible and of a cemetery site. Enclosed from New York Genealogical Records Committee (GRC) volumes B-33 and V-72 are copies of these records. The paper through Lovisa, who married Benjamin Randall, also provided transcriptions of newspaper items. The most recent paper, of 1978 through Sally, cited the enclosed pages from *The New England Historical and Genealogical Register*, volume 87. Enc. #1

Based on these applications and material, the DAR had listed the birth date and place of James Curtis as 10 February 1746, Goshen, New York. However, a review of the very first application and specifically one poorly cited reference suggests that he was born 1743 in Connecticut. Enc. #2

That first paper has a reference to "Thomas Wetherfield, CT." Enclosed are pages from *Thomas Curtis of Wethersfield, Connecticut* regarding a Joseph Curtis family that moved from Wethersfield to Goshen CT and then to Dutchess County NY. *Thomas Curtis* refers to 1) Hinman – see *Early Puritan Settlers of the Colony of Connecticut* and to 2) Stiles II – see *The History of Ancient Wethersfield*, Volume II. Enc. #3

Finally, a Goshen CT birth record lists James Curtis, son of Joseph, born Feb. 10, 1743. (A brother Joseph was born January 1747.) See *The Barbour Collection of CT Town Vital Records*, Volume 14. Enc. #4

*Dutchess County NY Tax Lists 1718-1787* shows a Joseph Curtis in the Nine Partners/Crum Elbow precinct area as early as 1753. James Curtis is also listed there from 1772-1779. Enc. #5

The DAR credits James Curtis with service in the Dutchess County Militia 6<sup>th</sup> Regt. as listed on page 248 of Roberts' *New York in the Revolution*. Enc. #6

From The Utica Globe, Norwich page. dated Jan. 28, 1910.

"Orlando Randall who died at his home in Moss Point, Miss., on Thursday last, was born in McDonough, March 9, 1831. His parents were Benjamin and Lovisa Randall, pioneer settlers in that section, having migrated from Connecticut.

Deceased was twice married. His first wife whose maiden name was Sally Martin, died while he resided in Norwich, and in 1868 he married Mrs. Caroline (Miner) Newton of Guilford, who survives him. He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Hubert L. Brown of Norwich and a gr. daughter, Mrs. Albert Mercer, of Pasadena, Cal.

Buried in Mt. Hope cemetery, Norwich."

"In Guilford Sept. 9, 1868 by Rev. J. L. Jones, Mr. Orlando Randall of Norwich to Mrs. Caroline M. Newton of Guilford, daughter of John D. Miner, Esq."

" Mrs. Caroline Miner Newton was born Guilford, Chenango Co., N. Y. July 21, 1837 and died July 18, 1913 in Norwich, N. Y.



He married 27 Mar 1755 Hannah \_\_\_\_\_, probably "the Wid." Whaples. (Mr. Chas. B. Curtis considers this Jonathan to be the son of Ebenezer<sup>4</sup> Dea. Jonathan<sup>3</sup>, John<sup>2</sup>, Thomas<sup>1</sup>) In favor of the arrangement presented here is the fact that this Jonathan is called on Wethersfield Records "Jonathan, 2d." (Stiles II, 265)

He married second Lena Wheeler.

He bought land in Goshen, Conn., in 1749, and moved to Redhook-on-the-Hudson in Dutchess Co., N.Y. in 1750. From there he moved to Dorset, Vt. Several of his sons served in the Continental Army. (Cutter, Western History of New York, II, 984; Stiles II, 265-266; Hinman, 780-781, 784)

appearance of danger from the Dutch. The Legislature ordered that the committee then appointed by the assembly, composed of the Governor, Deputy Governor and Assistants, Capt. Benjamin Newbury, Mr. Giles Hamlin, Mr. Wm. Wadsworth, Capt. Wm. Curtice, Lieut. Wm. Fowler and Lieut. Thomas Munson, to act as the grand committee of the Colony, in establishing and commissioning military officers in pressing men; horses, ships, "barques," or other vessels, arms, ammunition, provision, carriages, or any thing needful for defending the Colony; to manage, order and dispose of the militia of the Colony, in the best manner for the defence and safety of the Colony, &c. Many other scraps of record evidence, might be offered to prove the exalted standing of Capt. Wm. Curtice, in Conn., during his life. The Curtice family of Stratford, has been uniformly respectable from the first settlement of Wm. and John Curtice. The Curtice families of Fairfield County and New Haven, and Litchfield Counties, are generally descendants of the Stratford family. One or two of the Stratford Curtice family, removed and settled at Durham, after which, on the settlement of Granville, Mass., David, Aaron and Ebenezer Curtice, removed from Durham, to Granville, in company with Enoch, Aaron and Samuel Coe, of the Stratford family of Coe's, and Dea. Noah and Timothy Robinson, from Durham.

CURTIS, ZACHERIAH, b. Sept. 13, 1719, son of Joseph, of Wethersfield, removed to Goshen, in Litchfield County, where he purchased land in June, 1740. His children recorded at Goshen, are Joshua, b. Oct. 30, 1742; Salathiel, b. July, 1744, d.; Elias, b. Aug. 10, 1745. He removed after about five years residence.

CURTIS, JOSEPH, of Wethersfield, also removed from Wethersfield, to Goshen, on to land he purchased there in 1740, but in 1744, he sold his land in Goshen, and removed to Dutchess County, New York. His children recorded in Goshen, were Mary, b. May 24, 1738, b. at Wethersfield, and the following, b. at Goshen, Hezeliash, b. May, 1735; Hannah, b. 1736, d. in infancy; John, b. 1739; Honour, b. 1740; James, b. 1743; Dorothy, b. 1745; Joseph.

CURTIS, JOHN, of Durham, perhaps from Wethersfield, and perhaps one of the Stratford family, probably from Stratford, to Durham, as many from Stratford moved to Durham. He m. Dinah Newton, dau'r of Samuel, Nov. 18, 1747, she was b. at Durham, Nov., 1723, his children b. in Durham, were

CURTIS, SAMUEL, son of Abijah, who was son of John and Dinah, of Durham, m. Lucretia Brooks, Oct. 10, 1810. He began life at Durham, and had children, John, Samuel, Anna, Elizabeth, Phebe, Sarah, Hannah, and David, b. 1823, d. young. The family removed to Medina, Ohio, and had several children b. there. William Curtice was a Deacon at Medina.

CURTIS, HENRY, was an early and original settler at Windsor, Conn. He m. Elizabeth Abell, May 13, 1645. He lost one child in Windsor, in 1647. (Rowland.) He also had sons Samuel, b. April 26, 1649, and Nathaniel, b. July 15, 1651, at Windsor. He remained some years at Windsor, and little is recorded of his history. He became a proprietor and settler of Northampton, Mass., in 1653, where he d., Nov. 30, 1661. Henry Curtice had 5 lots of land in Watertown, Mass., early. (See *Watertown Record*.) This Henry was from England at an early period.

CURTISS, DEACON'S, estate was assessed at Guilford, at £60, 17s., in 1642 or 1650.

CURTICE, JOHN, of Hampton, Conn., and Hannah, his wife, had children bap. there, viz., Frederick, bap. July 27, 1760; Ephraim, bap. Oct. 17, 1762; Ebenezer, bap. in 1765; Anne, in 1767, and Elizabeth, March 4, 1770.

CURTICE, HOSEA, of Colchester, had a dau'r Abigail, bap. at Colchester, April 6, 1746; perhaps from Hebron, not traced.

At a General Court holden in Boston, Nov. 7, 1683, in answer to the petition of William Parke, John Boulds, Joseph Grigs, John Ruggles, and Edward Morris, selectmen of Roxbury, Mass., in their behalf, dated Oct. 10 and 17, 1683, for a tract of land for a village, to be laid out about Quilteset, to the quantity of 7 miles square. The Court granted the petition, with two provisions; the second was, that thirty families should settle on the plantation within three years from that time, and maintain "amongst ym an able, and orthodox, Godly minister." (See *Woodstock Proprietor's Record*.) The first recovery of Woodstock for a plantation, "Oct., Anno Dom., 1684. The town of Roxbury, aforesaid, in prosecution of the above grant, empowered JOHN CURTICE, Lieut. Samuel Ruggles, John Ruggles, sen'r, and Isaac Morris, to view the wilderness, and find a convenient place, where they could take up said grant; and after due

The years 1749, 1750, 1751, 1752, 1764 and 1776 are missing.

The first part of the year 1779 is missing.

The South line of the North Ward runs east from Staatsburgh

The South line of the Middle Ward runs east from mouth of the Wappingers Creek, so that people in the Nine Partners Precinct may be in either Ward.

When a person left Crum Elbow for Amenia I have so indicated. This does not mean that he moved.

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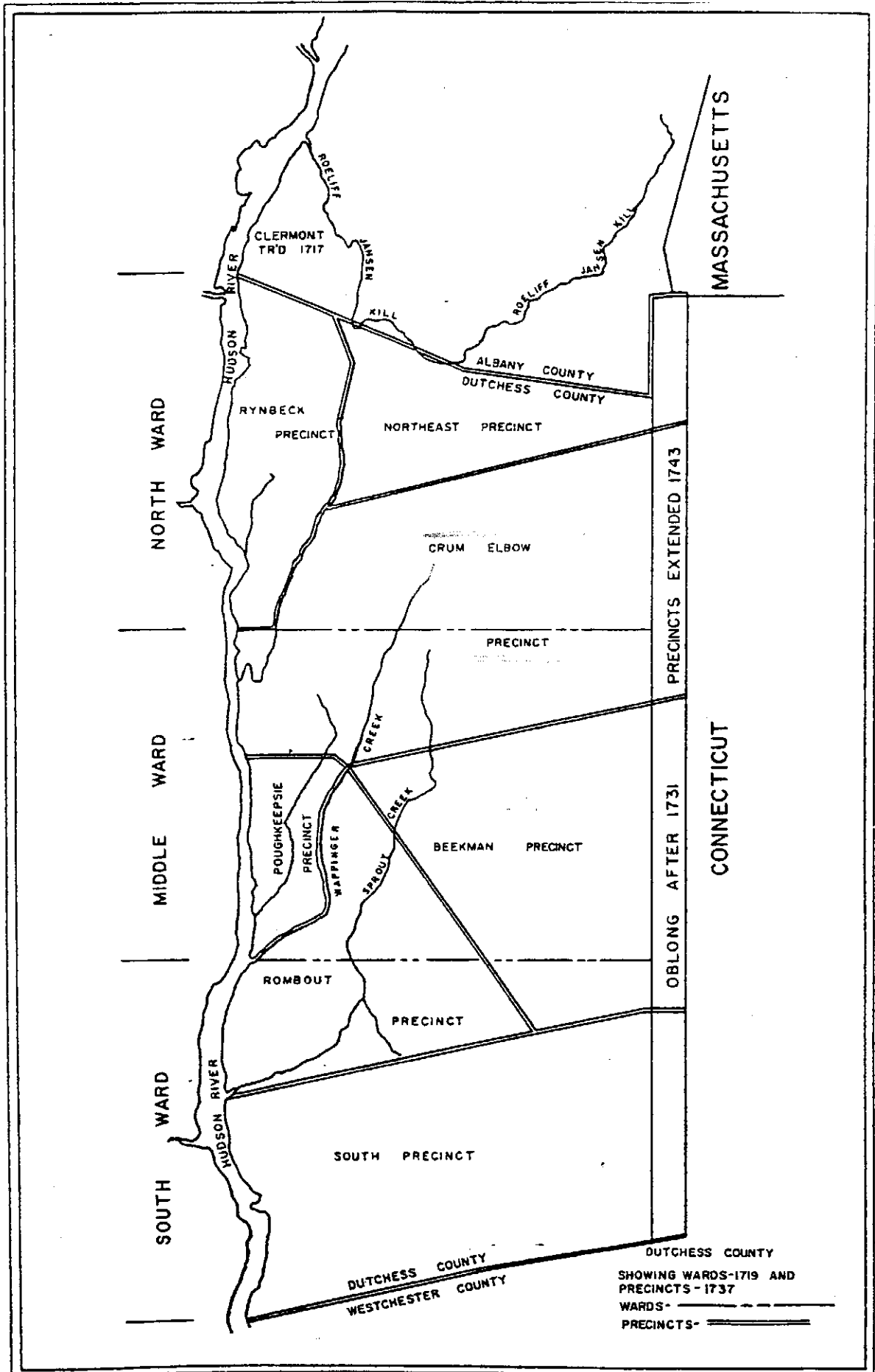
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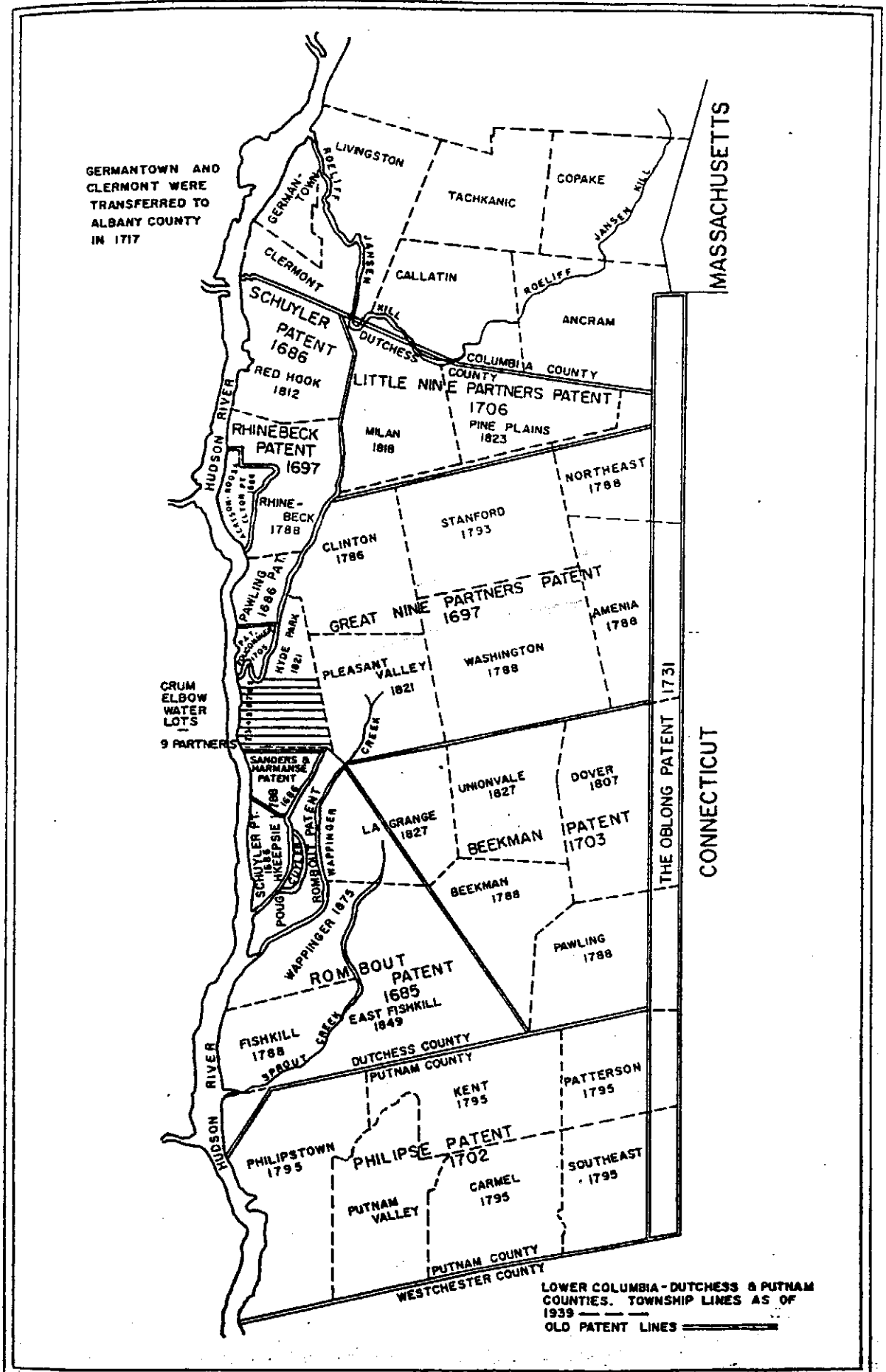
