

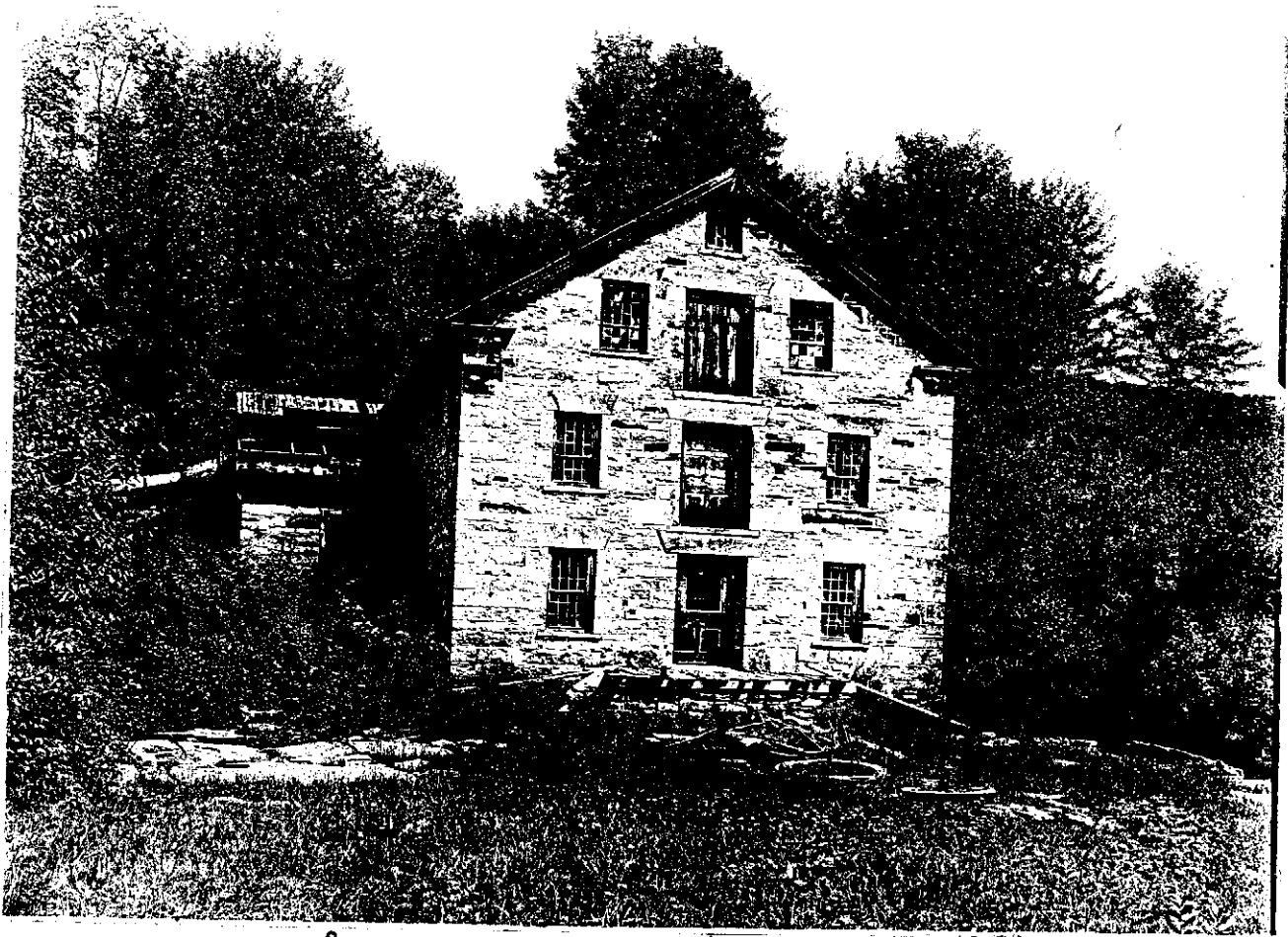

These early settlers were a fine body of people, who have made history of this vicinity. And thus it seemed wise to preserve what ever could be found about them .

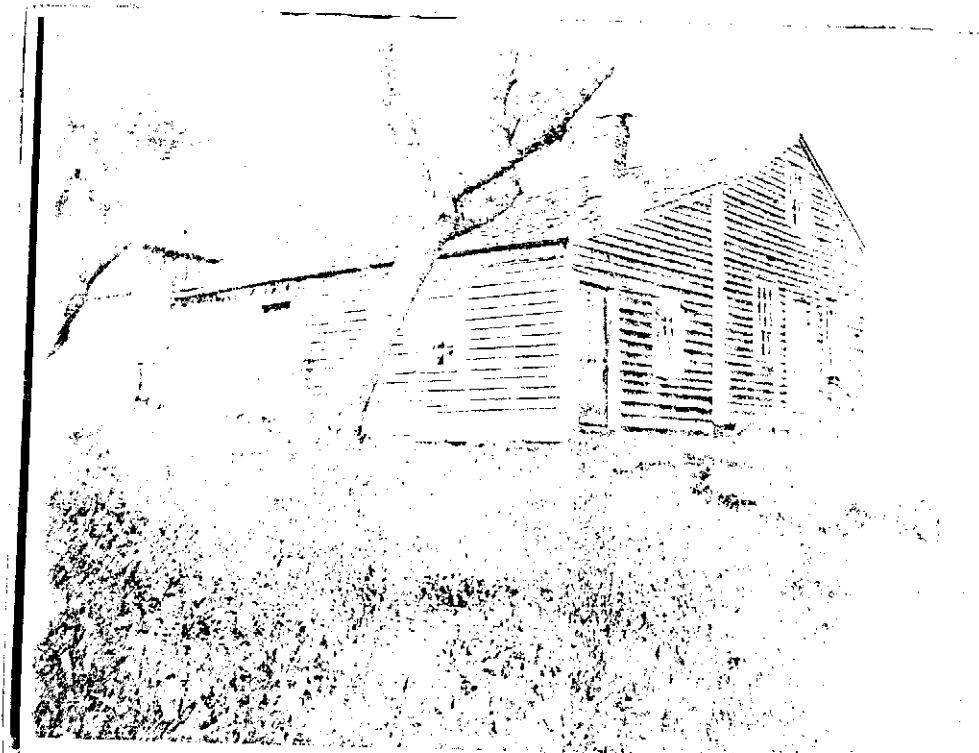

THE Lineage OF THOMAS CURTIS OF WETHERSFIELD, CONN.-

- I- Thomas was born in England in 1598..-Of the fifteen different Emigrants by the surname of Curtis. to come to America, there is reason to think that he is related to Richard Curtis. of Salem, Mass. and Southold, L.I., as Richard witnessed his will. If this Richard is related to Zacheus. of Salem and William of Salem. Some evidence points that way. -then we have four emigrants that are possibly related, Just how we dont know.
- Thomas Curtis married Elizabeth. sister of William Salmon of Southold, L.I.- Thomas Curtis was guardian of William Salmon's children., as their fathers brother-in-law he could b^e brother to Wm Salmon's wife., but this interpretation of the term of brother-in-law does not fit known facts.- The children inherited land in their own right from their mother's family, and were they blood relation to Thomas Curtis he would not have been neglectful as guardian.-The children appealed to the court for a change of guardian. (Records of Southold) and Richard Curtis signed this document as the interpretation of the term brother-in-law is that Thomas Curtis wife was the sister of William Salmon. CURTICE OR CURTIS. Thomas, of Wethersfield, died Nov 1681. Invt 1717-13 November, 1681. Taken 9 December, 1681, by Nathaniel Borman, Samuel B Butler, William Warner, -The children John, James, Joseph, Samuel, and Isaac Curtice Ruth Kimberly, Elizabeth Stoddard, The distribution as followeth.-

Page 22-6 March 1681(2) The distribution of the estate of Thomas Curtice of Wethersfield, Joyntly Consented to by all his children & witnessed by their subscribing:-Imprs. To John Curtice (who hath formerly received in houseing and lands, L. 123) fifty seven pounds. Samuel Curtice having all ready received his full portion by deed of gift from his father, the remayndar of the Inventoryed Estate to be Equally & divided to James Curtice Joseph, Isaac, Ruth & Elizabeth, to each of them an equal proportion what Joseph, Ruth & Elizabeth have formerly received being first added to the Sume totall of the Inventory, which doth amount to thirty seven pounds, and it is further Consented to by thevsated Children that in consideration of the service that Joseph Curtice and his wife have done for their father, during his life, there shall be soe much added to his portion as will make it up to £140 with £4 that he hath formerly received, which addition shall be equally deducted from the portions of the other Children according to what they have and shall receive, Samuel excepted.

Any good genealogical library will have several generations of all the fifteen different migrant Curtises who came to America between 1651 and 1670. This means that if we who are today over age fifty can give the name of our great grandparents, and possibly tell where they came from. The ancestry before them will be found printed in a library. This is often, tho not always true for some times we find Mark Twain's remark only too true "that genealogy deals freely with with important omissions?" Savage's "American Ancestry" is a good starting point (5 vol) for any surname. Then I get in touch with people who have collected Curtise data by finding their name and address in an index of genealogists found in every library. This method soon develops a large amount of data-Next I go to the Surogates records at the Count Court House for the next od kin to a Curtis, deceased. Another help is to inquire in a locality where they have lived; isto enquire of some elderly person living who is interested in the old local family histories. These persons can often give "in law" data as to the whereabouts of a Curtis girl or boy who may have a Curtis Bible with family records, and can

tell you of some member of the family who is interested in these records. All of these means were used in the case which follows.

Step 1- Several years ago in Moravia, south of Auburn, N.Y. I found an old Curtis Bible with all the descendants of Selden Curtis whose ancestry is well known (Deodatus) 4- Solomon, Jr (3) Solomon, Sr (2) Deodatus (1). Curtis emigrant to Braintree, Mass. Further inquiry at Moravia yielded another Curtis descendant, a Mr A. B. Baker who said his great grandmother was Rhoda Curtis. Then Mr Baker's wife said that she was also a Curtis descendant, her great grandmother being Theodosia Curtis. She knew no more, but Mr Baker gave me the address of a Mrs L in N.J. who had found his genealogy (Curtis).

Step 2-

I wrote Mrs L and she sent me Rhoda's whole lineage.; Rhoda, (6) Joseph (5) (4) (3) (2) Thomas (1) of Wethersfield, Conn. She said Joseph (5) Curtis, b-1747 had settled in Duansburg near Albany, N.Y. and died there, giving details. In return I happened to have a record of Joseph his son, (6) Curtis, which I found buried in Ohio, Herkimer, Co. N.Y. and I also had his Bible record from his granddaughter Mrs Bunce from Herkimer, N.Y. so I returned Mrs L kindness with this data which she lacked. She also gave me the address of Carl Curtis Pasadena, Cal. who she said was working on the line of Richard Curtis Salem, Mass. emigrant.

Step 3- I wrote Carl Curtis and he forwarded all of his data to be copied by the W.P.A. typists of Syracuse Library. In this was a Coleman (5) Curtis, Joshua (4) (3) Caleb (2) Richard (1) Curtis emigrant to Salem Mass. Coleman (5) had children Benjamin, David, Amzi (Amasa) of course and Silas all born in Orange Co. N.Y. Surrogate's records taken at Auburn and Ithaca showed David Curtis of Orange Co. dead in 1809 in Genoa, Cayuga Co. N.Y. and an Amzi dead in Newfield, Tompkins Co. N.Y. in 1838.

step 4-

I did a thing I seldom do. I wrote to Mary Curtis listed in the telephone book at Newfield, and I had luck, she was the great granddaughter of Amasa, and she had Coleman's will and lots of data. We found that Amzi's son David who died in Newfield in 1830, had a son Theodore and a daughter Theodosia, and that she was Mrs Baker's ancestress, and her Curtis record was clear.

step 5-

When in Vermont several years ago, some told me of a Mrs Howard at Manchester Center, who was collecting Curtis data, we exchanged records and gave me the address of Mrs Paul Thompson of Waterford Pa. we became much interested in tracing the line of John Curtis (5) Allen (4) David (3) Joseph (2) Thomas (1) of Wethersfield, Conn. emigrant, because he fought on both sides of the Revolution, deserting to Burgoyne, through anger at seeing Major Andre hanged.

step 6-

When in Stockbridge Mass a veritable bee-hive of Curtises, I was given the name of Miss Lucy Dresser of Spencerport N.Y. who with her father had collected much data. He was the son of Hannah, (6) Curtis, Able, (5) Elnathan (4) Samuel (3) Nathaniel (2) Henry (1) of Windsor, Conn. emigrant. Incidentally the connection between Samuel (3) and Nathaniel (2) is very probable but not proved. Among her data were several letters to her from Mrs Paul Thompson of Waterford, Pa. written in 1926-1927. I laid this aside to look over later.

step 7-

- CURTIS. -

Step 7-

I went to McDonough and picked up some James Harvey Curtis, and Daniles, and Mrs Emma Nagel of Norwich.

Step 8-

When in Greene, N.Y. I called on Hiram Curtis who said his grand father Stephen A Curtis was buried about a mile south of East McDonough. I had previously Stephen A Curtis Bible record, from Mrs Peter Padgett of Greene, and his son Luther Curtis Bible record from Mrs Roys of Oxford, N.Y. so I thought I would look at this cemetery. I found Stephen A Curtis stone, also one for a dau of Cornelius Curtis and those of three little children of Seth and Anna Curtis, so I suspected Seth to be related to these. Then I discovered a very old stone prone on the ground which read: "James Curtis died 1818 mae .75 yrs. and his wife Jemima, died 1808. I suspected them to be the parents of Seth Stephen and Cornelius, but knew I had no proof. I then went to Norwich.

Step 9-

Mrs Nagel said she had Seth's record but Mrs Tuttle of McDonough had borrowed it, and when it was returned she would send it. She said Seth had a son John who went to Somerset, Ky. and that there was a descendant of an older generation living in Norwich, now Mrs Hubert Brown. She called Mrs Brown who asked me to come over as she had an old Bible, and there believe it or not was old James Bible. In it was his wife Jemima Alger, Seth Cornelius and Stephen with all the dates in order. - I ought to have called it a day. So I found that some Curtises were buried in Oxford. The main cemetery gave up Ethan B (8) Ephraim (2) Oliver (6) ~~John Jr (5) - Ashley Sr (4) Moses (3) - Theophilus (2) Henry (1)~~ of Boston, Mass Emigrant. Ethan B was the father of Burdette, now living in Oxford, and of Kleber now deceased. Then I went to the Episcopal Cemetery (Van Wagonan) up near the Soldiers Home and found Major Oscar (4) Curtis, - George (3) John (2) born in England of Henry (1) emigrant to Rhode Island. These Curtises are not New England Yankees, at all like the rest of the Curtises are, they are new comers and are buried at the old church at White Store near South New Berlin, N.Y.

My eagle eye spied half a dozen old slabs on top of the gravel pit outside the wall of the Episcopal Cemetery, and there I found the whole outfit. - Solomon Curtis family, he b-1755, died 1838. - Solomon (5), Deodatus (4), Solomon, Jr (3), Solomon, Sr (2), Deodatus (1) Curtis, of Braintree, Mass. emigrant. Some good Curtises ought to take them up and put them inside the wall. - A few more loads of gravel out of this pit and their old bones will be exhumed. "Alas poor Yorick, I knew him Horatio".!

Step 10-

Home, a postal from Miss Dresser who thought I intended to keep her records forever. So the next day I went over all the material. I transcribed the notes of Curtis that Mrs Thompson sent to Miss Dresser, entering each alphabetically in my miscellaneous index. - Suddenly the following startling fact began ringing in my head. "James Curtis and wife Jemima, with children Seth, Cornelius, and Stephen, and some girls lived in Dutchess Co, and they stayed in Duanesburg N.Y. and then came to McDonough, N.Y. - Could Mrs L's Joseph (5) of Duanesburgh have had a brother James (5)? Frantically I go over my books, and there I find it, here it is James born 1743. It is he. - So there you see what a "kick" you can get out of genealogy."

The Curtis family were early settlers in the vicinity of Lake Ludlow McDonough. Stephen and Seth were the eldest sons of James and Jemima Alger Curtis. who came into this section from Wethersfield.Conn. James was an elderly man at the time of his coming having been born in 1746. and died Feb 14-1818, the next year after the town was set off from Preston. He married Jemima Alger in Conn. born 1758. died in McDonough Nov 1-1808. Both are buried in the Moore cemetery. which is near the old Curtis farm .now owned by Mr Hogan. and is in the section called East McDonough.
